FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Allegations against the petitioner Jaspal Singh in this anticipatory bail application under Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case registered by way of FIR No.63 dated 23.03.2017 at Police Station Beas, District Amritsar under Section 8-B of National Highway Act, 1956 are that the petitioner who happens to be Sarpanch and Namberdar of his village Naranjanpur along with others on 23.03.2017 had held a Dharna and in the process had illegally and forcibly parked his tractor-trolley in the middle of the road thus, putting the traffic to halt and harassment to the public at large.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in compliance of the orders of interim bail dated 14.04.2017 passed by this Court, the petitioner has joined investigations and has also handed over the tractor-

trolley in question to the police and that nothing more is to be recovered from him which is not controverted by learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Agya Pal, from Police Station Beas, District Amritsar who submits that the petitioner is no longer required for further investigation and nothing is to be recovered from him and that he has no objection if the interim order is made absolute.

In view of what has been stated above and in the light of orders passed earlier together with the fact that tractor-trolley in question already stands recovered, the interim bail granted to the petitioner vide order dated 14.04.2017 is made absolute on the same terms and conditions till submission of report under Section 173 Cr.P.C. (challan). Thereafter, petitioner will be permitted to furnish regular bail bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.

The petition stands disposed off accordingly.
