On 14.04.2017, following order was passed by this
Court:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that as per compromise executed between the parties on 16.09.2016, an amount of Rs.2,75,000/- was to be paid to the complainant any time after 16.10.2016 i.e. at the time of filing of petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act. The remaining amount was to be paid thereafter at the time of passing of the decree. Complainant did not come forward to accept the amount in question, whereas petitioners always remained ready and willing to perform their part of obligation arising out of compromise in question.

Notice of motion for 15.05.2017.

In the meanwhile, petitioners are directed to appear before the SHO/Investigating Officer to join investigation on 19.04.2017 and in the event of their arrest, they shall be enlarged on ad interim bail, subject to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, petitioners shall abide by the conditions incorporated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners shall abide by the terms of compromise.

Learned counsel for the complainant submitted that the complainant has received an amount of Rs.2.75 lacs by means of demand draft and the remaining amount would be paid at the time of second motion.

Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Manjit Singh submitted that the petitioners have already joined the investigation pursuant to order dated 14.04.2017 and further submitted that the petitioners are no more required for further investigation.

In view of above, interim order dated 14.04.2017 is made absolute.

Petition stands disposed of.
