INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioner-Kunwardeep Singh has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.220 dated 13.10.2014, registered at Police Station Sohana, District Mohali, under Sections 420, 409, 465, 467, 468, 471, 167 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the FIR, the main accused is Er. Jaswinder Singh as all negotiations were conducted and payments

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and receipts were issued by him. There are also allegations against accused-Jaswinder Singh and Balkar Singh for interfering into the affairs of the society etc. It is also mentioned in the FIR that all the works were being done, controlled and supervised by Er.Jaswinder Singh alongwith Balkar Singh. It is also mentioned in the FIR that all the materials were purchased by Balkar Singh, Er. Jaswinder Singh and Kunwardeep Singh.

All the offences are triable by the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class. The petitioner has been in custody since 27.02.2017. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of Rs.50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
