By this petition, filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C, the petitioner seeks the concession of 'regular bail'.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that though the petitioner is now facing trial only on account of the fact that he was earlier declared as a proclaimed offender, the other five co-accused who faced trial earlier, have already been acquitted vide a judgment of the learned trial Court dated 01.07.2016, a copy of which has been annexed as Annexure P-4 with the petition.

Learned State counsel does not deny the aforesaid fact and further on query, submits that as per his instructions, no appeal has been filed against the aforesaid judgment of the trial Court.

Keeping in view the aforesaid fact, the petitioner is ordered to be admitted to bail upon his furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.
