Petitioner-Vikrant Sharma has filed this petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.116 dated 12.08.2016, registered at Police Station B-Division, Amritsar City, District Amritsar, under Sections 419, 420, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

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From the record, I find that as per the allegations in the FIR, one Vikram Singh executed an agreement to sell in favour of the complainant in respect of a plot bearing No.B-1325 measuring 75 yards and Rs.2 lacs were given to the said Vikram Singh at that time. The sale deed was to be executed on 08.12.2015. However, the complainant came to know that Vikrant Sharma had impersonated himself as Vikram Singh and in fact, actual owner of said plot is one Harpreet Singh, who is residing abroad.

The case is based on documentary evidence. The petitioner has been in custody since 18.03.2017. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹40,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
