Quashing of FIR No. 96 dated 08.04.2017, under Sections 323/324/354/452/506 IPC, registered at Police Station, Sector 39, Chandigarh (Annexure P-1) is sought on the basis of compromise/affidavit dated 29.04.2017 (Annexure P-2).

The F.I.R was registered on the basis of statement made by Ajay Kumar-complainant (respondent No.2) to the effect that on 06.04.2017, at about 08:15 A.M., his brother-in-law namely Deepak Mehra (petitioner) entered his house with a knife in his hand and started abusing the complainant. Wife of the complainant namely Jyoti requested him to stop, but he started abusing her and threatened to kill the entire family of complainant. Thereafter, he pushed wife of the complainant, as a result of

which, she fell down. Thereafter, accused-petitioner tried to kill son of the complainant with the help of his knife. Complainant came forward to save his child, however, petitioner inflicted injury on the right hand of complainant with his knife. Meanwhile, wife of the complainant called the police, upon which, accused-petitioner ran away from the spot. In this background, the FIR was registered.

After registration of the FIR, with the intervention of respectable persons, the matter has now been amicably resolved between the parties vide compromise deed dated 29.04.2017 (Annexure P-2). In this regard, complainant-respondent No.2 (Ajay Kumar) has given his affidavit dated 29.04.2017.

In compliance with the order dated 05.05.2017 passed by this Court, parties have got recorded their statements before the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate. Report dated 10.05.2017 from the Judicial Magistrate, Ist Class, Chandigarh, has been received in this regard. As per report, Ajay Kumar-respondent No.2 (complainant) made his statement on 10.05.2017 to the effect that with the intervention of respectable persons, he has compromised the matter with accused-petitioner out of his own free will and without any coercion or pressure, vide compromise deed dated 29.04.2017 Ex.C1. He has no objection if, the aforesaid FIR is quashed. Separate statement of Deepak Mehra-petitioner was also recorded to the same effect. In view of separate statements given by the parties, the court is satisfied that the compromise is valid and genuine one.

Consequently, in view of the status report and the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of Madan Mohan Abbot vs. State of Punjab 2008(2) RCR (Criminal) 429, the law laid down by the Full

Bench of this Court in the case of **Kulwinder Singh and Ors. vs. State of Punjab and another 2007(3) RCR (CrI.) 1052**, this Court is of the view that no useful purpose would be served in prolonging the litigation.

Accordingly, FIR No. 96 dated 08.04.2017, under Sections 323/324/354/452/506 IPC, registered at Police Station, Sector 39, Chandigarh, is quashed with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom qua the petitioner.

The petition stands disposed of accordingly.
