SUDIP AHLUWALIA, J. (ORAL)

In this petition, the petitioners, who are accused in F.I.R. No. 405, dated 12.07.2007, under Sections 149/323/324/452 of the Indian Penal Code, and offence under Section 326 of the Indian Penal Code was added subsequently, registered at Police Station City Panipat, District Panipat, (Annexure P-1), have prayed for quashing of F.I.R. with all subsequent proceedings pending in the Court of the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Panipat, on the basis of compromise.

[2]. During pendency of petition, the complainant has arrived at a settlement with the accused vide Compromise Deed (Annexure P-4), which

is duly signed by him. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. The Chief Judicial Magistrate, Panipat, vide report dated 18.07.2017, has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

[3]. Respondents No. 2 to 8 are represented by their counsel.

[4]. In view of the report of the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Panipat, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in “Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another”, 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and “Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another”, (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has himself compromised the dispute with the petitioners/ accused persons.

[5]. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. F.I.R. No. 405, dated 12.07.2007, under Sections 149/323/324/452 of the Indian Penal Code, and offence under Section 326 of the Indian Penal Code was added subsequently, registered at Police Station City Panipat, District Panipat, (Annexure P-1), and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed on the basis of compromise qua the present petitioners.
