The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking quashing of FIR No.128 dated 29.09.2013 registered under Sections 295-A, 429, 153-A IPC read with Section 8(1)-4A/4B/8 of Cow Slaughter Act 1955 at Police Station Jamalpur, District Ludhiana in view of compromise.

Heard learned counsel for the rival parties.

Learned counsel appearing for respondent No.2/complainant submits that compromise has been arrived at between the parties.

This Court had made order dated 20.01.2017 asking for recording of statement in order to find out the correctness and genuineness of the compromise said to have been arrived at between the parties.

Accordingly, statements have been recorded by the trial Court and report has been received by this Court. Looking to the report it

is seen that the compromise is voluntary and genuine. I have seen the offences registered against the petitioner. Looking to the nature of the offence I think the compromise/compounding should be allowed.

In view of the above, I make the following order:

ORDER

- (i) CRL. MISC. No.M-1697 OF 2017 is allowed.
- (ii) The FIR No.128 dated 29.09.2013 registered under Sections 295-A, 429, 153-A IPC read with Section 8(1)-4A/4B/8 of Cow Slaughter Act 1955 at Police Station Jamalpur, District Ludhiana, is quashed along with all consequential proceedings, qua the petitioner.
