Petitioner seeks the concession of anticipatory bail in FIR No.3dated 08.03.2017, under Section 406, 498-A IPC, registered at Police Station Women Cell, Ferozepur.

It is informed that during the pendency of this petition, the matter has been amicably resolved between the parties. Petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, has been filed by the petitioner and his wife. Their statements at first motion have been recorded and part of the settled amount received by her.

Learned counsel for respondent no.2 verifies the aforesaid and submits that his client has no objection in case this petition is allowed subject to the petitioner strictly adhering to the terms and conditions of the settlement.

There are no allegations on behalf of the State that the petitioner is likely to abscond, if released on bail.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances as above, especially the settlement between the parties, but without commenting upon or expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this petition is allowed. Consequently, order dated 19.05.2017, is made absolute.

Liberty is afforded to respondent no.2 to move an appropriate application in this matter in case the terms and conditions of the settlement between the parties are not adhered to by the petitioner.

It is reiterated that none of the observations made herein above are a reflection on the merits of the case and shall have no bearing on the trial.
