Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that despite an FIR having been registered at the instance of the petitioner, alleging therein the commission of an offence punishable under Sections 420/406/120-B IPC, against the persons named in the FIR, no action has been taken thereafter by the police.

The petitioner thereafter also made complaints to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Sri Muktsar Sahib, as also to the Deputy Inspector General of Police, Bathinda Range, but no action has been taken, though the DIG had marked the representation/complaint of the petitioner to the SSP on 30.03.2017, as per the endorsement on the copy of the representation (Annexure P-4).

Consequently, this petition is disposed of with a direction to the Deputy Inspector General of Police, Bathinda Range (respondent no.2), to ensure that action as per law, as is warranted, is taken on the representation of the petitioner within a period of one month from the date

of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

It is made clear that this Court has not expressed any opinion on the contentions either made in this petition, or in the representation or in the FIR.
