FATEH DEEP SINGH J.(Oral)

The allegations against the petitioner in this regular bail application under Section 439 Cr.P.C. in case FIR No.63 dated 6.7.2011, under Sections 356 and 379 IPC, P.S. Baghapurana, District Moga, are that on 28.6.2011 the complainant Jaspal Kaur along with his son Manjit Singh and grant daughter Jagdeep Kaur of village Dalluwal were on the way and after seeing rush at Chanwala turn in Bagha Purana the complainant got down from the vehicle and standing at Chanwala turn on Bagha Purana Nihal Singh Wala road. At around 4 PM a maruti car came there being driven by a man with four aged ladies offered her a lift. Thereafter the complainant sat on the rear seat of the vehicle with unknown two ladies

sitting on both the sides and in the process they cut her gold gajra of 2 ½ tolas and gold chain of 1 ½ tolas, leading to registration of the present case.

The contentions of learned counsel for the petitioner are that the petitioner is behind the bars since 5.10.2016 and that neither she has been identified nor named in the FIR. The trial is not likely to conclude in near future.

Learned State counsel has opposed the grant of bail to the petitioner on the ground of heinousness of offence and seriousness of allegations. He further states that the accused are facing number of cases.

Appreciating the submissions and keeping in view the nature of offence and the fact that legality and validity of the allegations would be seen at the time of trial. Keeping in view the period of incarceration undergone by the petitioner and the fact that the trial will take a long time to conclude, this Court is of the opinion that further detention of the petitioner in the present case is unwarranted. Accordingly, she is ordered to be released on regular bail to the satisfaction of the trial Court.

The petition stands disposed off accordingly.
