Petitioner-Vinod @ Bodi has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.17 dated 23.01.2017, registered at Police Station Adampur, District Hissar, under Sections 451 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the allegations in the FIR, complainant is having 100/125 pigs and has prepared a pig farm. On

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17.01.2017, at about 10.00 P.M., the complainant went to check his pigs at his farm. He saw three persons entered into his pig farm and they tried to nab the pigs. When the complainant raised *lalkara*, then all three persons fled away from the spot, however, they left their motor-cycle in front of his pig farm.

The petitioner has been in custody since 14.02.2017. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case. Moreover, co-accused namely Kamal has already been released on bail by this Court vide order dated 03.04.2017 passed in CRM-M-10642-2017.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹35,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
