This petition under Section 438 of the Criminal Procedure Code has been filed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.163 dated 17.12.2016 registered under Sections 326, 323 and 324 read with Section 34 of Indian Penal Code (In short IPC) at Police Station Garhshankar, District Hoshiarpur.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present FIR and he is not involved in any other FIR. He further contends that co-accused, namely, Rimpay and Rahul have already been granted regular bail by this Court.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and have gone through the case file.

In brief, allegations against the petitioner are that the petitioner along with co-accused gave two blows with sharp edged weapon i.e. datar on the head of the complainant. Complainant, namely, Mohinder Singh received as many as 15 injuries out of which 11 injuries were inflicted with the blunt weapon and three injuries were declared to be grievous in nature.

Keeping in view that as many as 15 injuries were caused to the complainant, no case for grant of concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner is made out. This Court feels that it is a fit case where custodial interrogation of the petitioner is required to unearth the truth.

In the circumstances, no case for grant of concession of anticipatory bail is made out.

Consequently, the application for grant of pre-arrest bail stands dismissed.

Anything observed hereinabove shall not be construed as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case.
