This petition under Section 482 of the Criminal Procedure Code has been filed for issuance of directions to the learned trial Court to conclude the proceedings of trial in FIR No.370 dated 28.12.2005 (Annexure P-1) registered under Sections 452, 454, 380, 427, 354, 376 read with Section 511, 336, 506 and 148 read with Section 149 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 27 of Arms Act at Police Station Civil Lines, Patiala.

In pursuance of the order dated 02.06.2017, report from the Additional District & Sessions Judge, Patiala has been received.

Report perused.

Notice of motion.

At the asking of the Court, Ms. Anju Arora, Addl.AG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State. A complete copy of the paper book has been furnished to the learned counsel, in the Court.

As per the petitioner, his version was not gone into by the Court and the petitioner was constrained to approach Punjab Women Commission.

On the report prepared by ADGP, Internal Vigilance Cell-cum-Human Rights, the present FIR was registered. Thereafter, respondents have been pre-empting all the efforts of the petitioner to get the matter finalized which has generated agonizing pain and loss to resources. Vide order dated 04.05.2015, this Court had directed the trial Court to conclude the proceedings expeditiously.

Keeping in view the fact that FIR dates back to the year 2005, without adverting to the merits of the case, at this stage the trial Court is directed to conclude the trial expeditiously preferably within six months from the receipt of certified copy of the order.
