FIR was lodged against one-Gulzari Ram, stated to be a Police Officer and his daughter-in-law on the allegation that they had trespassed into the complainant's landed property which had been originally acquired by her husband way back in the year 1993. The complainant had also alleged that the FIR named accused persons had forged a Register Covenant dated 16th May, 2008, which in any case does not relate to her own property.

During investigation, the police have come across an alleged fraud attributed to the petitioner to the effect that after having purchased certain lands from one Rajbir Singh vide two sale deeds executed on 12th of April, 2006, he ostensibly transferred the same in favour of two persons namely, Kulwinder Singh and Sukhchain Singh on 26th of October, 2006, but actually the possession delivered was of the property which was different from that mentioned in the transferred deeds.

His vendees, namely, Kulwinder Singh and Sukhchain Singh in turn transferred the properties purchased from him in favour of co-accused-Nirmal Kaur in the year 2008.

In the given circumstances, the controversy involved is predominantly civil in nature. Involvement of the petitioner, if any is much much prior to lodging of the FIR and admittedly he is not even named in the same.

For the aforesaid reasons, his prayer for anticipatory bail is allowed and the interim bail granted to him earlier on June 05, 2017 is, accordingly, made absolute.
