LISA GILL, J.

This order shall dispose of two petitions i.e. CRM-M No. 22862 of 2016 and CRM-M No. 22083 of 2016.

CRM-M No. 22862 of 2016 has been filed by Navdeep Singh - husband of the complainant and CRM-M No. 22083 of 2016 has been filed by Surinder Kaur and Paramjit Singh, mother-in-law and father-in-law respectively, of the complainant. They seek anticipatory bail in FIR No. 31 dated 04.06.2016 registered under Sections 498A, 406 IPC at Police Station Women Cell, Amritsar, District Amritsar.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the matter has been amicably settled between the parties. Petitioner – Navdeep Singh and his wife – Parmit Kaur @ Varsha have decided to part ways. CRM M-No. 34153 of 2016 has been filed for quashing of the above said FIR on the basis of settlement effected between the parties.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from Head Constable Davinder Singh affirms the factum of settlement between the parties. There are no allegations on behalf of the State that petitioners are likely to abscond or that they are likely to dissuade the witnesses from deposing true facts in the Court, if released on bail.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances noted above but without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, it is considered just and expedient to allow these petition. Consequently, order dated 12.07.2016 in CRM-M No. 22862 of 2016 and order dated 01.07.2016 in CRM-M No. 22083 of 2016 are made absolute.
