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HARINDER SINGH SIDHU, J.

This is a petition for the grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No. 116 dated 4.5.2017 registered at Police Station Agroha, District Hisar, for the offence under Sections 147, 149, 323, 341 and 506 IPC.

The petitioner is a doctor by profession and he is a second year student of M.S. Surgery at MAM College and Hospital Agroha.

The allegation in the FIR recorded on the statement of one Mukesh is that he is working at MAMC Agroha in electricity department as a JE. On 3.5.2017 in the evening at around 09.20 pm he was called by the Administrator of Maharaja Aggarwal Medical College, Agroha. When he was at a short distance from the office of administrator, the petitioner alongwith 10/15 persons was standing there. The petitioner stopped the complainant. He had a stick in his hand and hit him on his back, hands and feet with the same. The complainant was thereafter taken to the government hospital for treatment.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that a colleague of the petitioner namely Dr. Nishu has earlier filed a complaint against the complainant alleging molestation in regard where to FIR No. 115 dated 4.5.2017 under Sections 323, 354(A) and 506 IPC was registered at Police Station Agroha. The instant FIR has been lodged as a counter blast to the said FIR. He further states that the petitioner is a doctor by profession and he has no previous criminal record.

Considering the aforesaid facts, in my view it is a fit case for grant of the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, it is directed that in the event of his arrest, the petitioner- Pawan shall be released on interim anticipatory bail to the satisfaction of the Arresting/ Investigating Officer, subject to the condition provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. The petitioner is also directed to join the investigation and cooperate with the Investigating Agency, as and when required.
