Both the above captioned petitions have been taken taken up together for disposal being arising out of the same FIR.

Both the petitions have been filed under Section 438 of Cr.P.C., for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in the event of arrest in FIR No.61 dated 08.05.2017, under Section 306 of Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Balachaur, District SBS Nagar.

The petitioner in Crl. Misc. No. M-22541 of 2017 is the sister-in-law and the petitioners in Crl. Misc. No.27712 of 2017 are father-in-law and mother-in-law of the deceased Daljit Kaur.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the petitioners are falsely implicated in the present case and on the direction of this Court, have joined the investigation. It is submitted that after the filing of the instant petitions and grant of interim anticipatory bail, challan has been presented and now the matter is to be committed to the Court of Session, in which proceedings they have already been granted regular bail. It is also contended that nothing is to be recovered from them.

Learned AAG Punjab for the respondent-State, on instructions from the Investigating Officer, submits that petitioners have joined the investigation and they are not required for the custodial interrogation.

In view of the facts that the petitioners are not required for custodial interrogation and have joined the investigation, without commenting on the merits of the case, the petitions are allowed and orders dated 23.06.2017 and 02.08.2017 granting interim bail to the petitioners are

made absolute subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438 Sub
Section 2 Clauses (i)(ii) and (iii) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
