The petitioners have filed these petitions under Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.69 dated 26.05.2017 registered under Sections 420 & 120-B IPC and Section 25 of the Immigration Act, at Police Station Division No.8, District Ludhiana.

Heard learned counsel for the rival parties and the complainant, who is present in person.

This Court had granted ad-interim bail to the petitioners on 05.07.2017 in CRM-M-23195-2017 and on 14.07.2017 in CRM-M-25006-2017.

Learned counsel for the petitioners were asked to take instructions as to the payment of entire amount in the sum of ₹3,30,000/-. Learned counsel for the petitioners state that a compromise has been arrived at between the parties that the complainant will accept the amount of ₹2,50,000/- only.

The interim orders were made in the month of July, 2017. The petitioners were given enough time. Now counsel for the petitioners prayed that two months' time be granted even to pay ₹2,50,000/- because the petitioners would pay the same after harvesting the paddy.

Looking to the fact that the complainant had parted with ₹3,30,000/- and looking to the further fact that the complainant had agreed to compromise because he was to get the payment early, I think, now the petitioners cannot be given any indulgence.

However, further indulgence is granted to the petitioners, provided that they have to pay the entire amount of ₹3,30,000/- by demand draft in favour of the complainant within a period of two months from today.

It is made clear that if the amount of ₹3,30,000/- is not paid within the stipulated period, the interim orders, in both the petitions,

granting anticipatory bail to the petitioners, shall come to end automatically and police shall arrest the petitioners.

Disposed of accordingly.
