The instant petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking regular bail in case F.I.R. No. 419, dated 17.07.2016, registered under Section 302 of the Indian Penal Code, at Police Station Palam Vihar, Gurugram, District Gurugram.

It is submitted that the petitioner has been in detention for a period of more than one year and that no meaningful evidence, through the statements of the witnesses examined so far, has come on record against him. He, therefore, seeks his release on bail, at this stage.

Ld. State counsel submits that out of total 21 charge-sheeted

witnesses, 11 witnesses have already been examined and another 4 private witnesses still remain to be examined, and the next date in the Ld. Court below is 08.08.2017.

For this reason, the bail application is rejected at this stage. Ld. Trial Court is directed to record the evidence of all the remaining private witnesses, preferably within a period of one month from the date of communication of this order, after which, petitioner shall be at liberty to approach the Ld. Trial Court for bail.

The present petition is, accordingly, disposed off.
