This petition has been filed for cancellation of anticipatory bail granted to respondent No.2 in case FIR No.78, dated 30.4.2015, registered under Sections 420, 120-B of the IPC, at Police Station Sarabha Nagar, District Ludhiana.

Bail was granted to respondent No.2 as far back as 1.9.2015. At that time, it had been agreed between the parties that respondent No.2 would transfer his property in the name of the petitioner/complainant. Over the past 1½ year, several efforts have been made by the parties as well as the Court to try and ensure fructification of that agreement between the parties. The petitioner/complainant has used the leverage of this petition also.

However, till date, the matter has not fructified.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties, I am not in a position to categorically lay down that the agreement between the parties could not fructify because of any mala fide of respondent No.2. There are various reasons for the same.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner states that she would not press this petition and would seek her remedy in the civil Court where the suit has already been filed by her. Consequently, this petition is dismissed as withdrawn.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending Misc. Applications, if any, also stand disposed of.
