ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J. (ORAL)

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 0263, dated 05.05.2017, under Section 188 IPC read with Sections 4, 5 and 19 of the Punjab Land Preservation Act, 1900.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the allegation against the petitioner is that he had carried out illegal construction and the matter is also listed before the NGT on 10.07.2017. Learned counsel further contends that all other sections under which the FIR has been registered are bailable except Section 188 of the IPC. The Section 188 IPC was also bailable but now with the notification issued by the State Government, it has been made non-bailable although the maximum sentence under this section remains six months. He also states that the petitioner is 77 years of age.

This Court, vide order dated 09.08.2017, had directed the petitioner to join investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel upon instructions from ASI Brahm Parkash states that the petitioner has joined investigation.

In view of the above and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, the order dated 09.08.2017, granting ad-interim bail to the petitioner, is hereby made absolute. However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

The petition stands disposed of accordingly.
