SUDIP AHLUWALIA, J. (ORAL)

In this petition, the petitioner, who is an accused in F.I.R. No. 63, dated 26.04.2016, under Sections 419, 420, 465, 468, 471 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Division No. 1, Jalandhar City, (Annexure P-1), has prayed for quashing of F.I.R. with all subsequent proceedings pending in the Court of the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Jalandhar, on the basis of compromise.

[2]. During pendency of petition, the complainant has arrived at a settlement with the accused vide Affidavit (Annexure P-2), which is duly

signed by him. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. The Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Jalandhar , vide report dated 11.09.2017, has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

[3]. Respondent No. 2 is represented by his counsel.

[4]. In view of the report of the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Jalandhar, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **“Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another”, 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543** and **“Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another”, (2014) 6 SCC 466**, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has himself compromised the dispute with the petitioner/accused person.

[5]. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. F.I.R. No. 63, dated 26.04.2016, under Sections 419, 420, 465, 468, 471 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Division No. 1, Jalandhar City, (Annexure P-1), and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed on the basis of compromise qua the present petitioner.
