LISA GILL, J.

The petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in FIR No. 126 dated 27.06.2016 registered under Sections 498A, 406 IPC at Police Station Dera Bassi, SAS Nagar.

The above said FIR is a fall out of matrimonial discord between the petitioner and his wife - respondent No. 2. It is informed that the parties have amicably resolved their entire dispute before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court. The terms and conditions of the settlement have been reduced into writing on 12.12.2016. A copy of the said settlement/agreement is on record. The parties have decided to part ways.

Learned counsel for respondent No. 2 as well as learned counsel for the State, on instructions from HC Rajinder Kumar, affirm and verify the factum of settlement between the parties. There are no allegations on behalf of the State that petitioner is likely to abscond or that he is likely to dissuade the witnesses from deposing true facts in the Court, if released on bail.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances as above but without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, it is considered just and expedient to allow this petition. Consequently, order dated 29.07.2016 is made absolute.
