SUDIP AHLUWALIA, J (ORAL)

The petitioner was challaned for the offences under Section 279, 304A of the IPC, which are both bailable. His contention is that he had amicably compromised the matter with the affected party on account of which, he was under a misconception that there was no further need to attend the Court. Consequently, he was declared a Proclaimed Offender after his presence could not be otherwise secured.

From the order passed by the Ld. Court below (Annexure P-2), it transpires that, by now, he has remained in detention for almost four months since before 23.03.2017.

In the given circumstances, considering the nature of offences allegedly committed by the petitioner, his further detention does not appear to be called for, at this stage.

The petitioner may, therefore, be released on bail to the satisfaction of the Ld. Trial Court, subject to imposition of appropriate terms and conditions considering his past conduct.
