Petitioner-Kamaljit Singh @ Honey has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.328 dated 16.12.2016, registered at Police Station City Khanna, District Ludhiana, under Sections 307, 452, 323, 324, 506, 427 and 379-B of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that first of all, no injury has been declared as dangerous to life. The injury on the head of injured has been

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declared as simple one. As per the prosecution version, the main allegation is that the petitioner came to the shop of complainant for mobile re-charging, but he did not pay the money and some altercation took place between them. Later on, the present petitioner, who was having a sword in his hand, came to the shop of complainant and gave a sword blow on the head of complainant. The said injury has been declared as simple one. After causing injury, the present petitioner also snatched the mobile of complainant.

The petitioner has been in custody since 24.12.2016. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
