SUDIP AHLUWALIA, J. (ORAL)

In this petition, the petitioners, who are accused in F.I.R. No. 117, dated 25.05.2016, under Sections 324, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code (Sections 323, 506 of the Indian Penal Code added later on vide D.D.R. No. 28, dated 25.05.2016) registered at Police Station Kotwali, Bathinda, District Bathinda, Punjab, (Annexure P-1 colly), have prayed for quashing of F.I.R. with all subsequent proceedings pending in the Court of the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bathinda, on the basis of compromise.

[2]. During pendency of petition, the complainant has arrived at a settlement with the accused vide Compromise Deed (Annexure P-2), which

is duly signed by him. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. The Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bathinda, vide report dated 31.08.2017, has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure.

[3]. Respondent No. 2 is represented by his counsel.

[4]. In view of the report of the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bathinda, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **“Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another”, 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543** and **“Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another”, (2014) 6 SCC 466**, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has himself compromised the dispute with the petitioners/accused persons.

[5]. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. F.I.R. No. 117, dated 25.05.2016, under Sections 324, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code (Sections 323, 506 of the Indian Penal Code added later on vide D.D.R. No. 28, dated 25.05.2016) registered at Police Station Kotwali, Bathinda, District Bathinda, Punjab, (Annexure P-1 colly), and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed on the basis of compromise qua the present petitioners.
