Prayer in this petition filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. is for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.3 dated 07.01.2017 under Sections 324, 326, 34 IPC, registered at Police Station Ramdas, Amritsar Rural, District Amritsar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner is in custody since 11.05.2017. The allegation against the petitioner is that after marriage, petitioner used to abuse his wife and when the complainant-wife reported to her parents, a compromise has been effected between the parties and the complainant re-settled in her matrimonial home. However, on 31.12.2016, when she was preparing tea, her sister-in-law Rani started fighting with the complainant on the ground that she was harassing her brother. In the process, co-accused Atras Masih caught hold her arms and the petitioner threw hot tea on her body.

Learned State counsel states that the concerned investigating officer is not present today. However, learned State counsel does not dispute the period of custody of the petitioner and states that challan in the case has yet not presented.

Having heard learned counsel for the parties and considering the fact that the petitioner is in custody since 11.05.2017, coupled with the fact that trial in the case may take long time, I deem it appropriate to release him on regular bail.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is admitted on regular bail, subject to furnishing of his bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of CJM/Duty Magistrate, Amritsar.
