Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner had been admitted to regular bail by the learned trial Court and he was also coming present as and when summoned by that Court. However, on 3.11.2016 he could not come present as he had noted the wrong date.

He further submits that on no other occasion was the petitioner ever absent from the Court proceedings.

In view of the petitioners' admitted absence, I see no ground to grant the concession of anticipatory bail. Hence, this petition, seeking the concession of anticipatory bail, is dismissed.

However, upon the petitioner surrendering before the trial Court and presenting an application for regular bail, it would be disposed of on the same day by that Court, on its own merits, looking into the antecedents whether the petitioner was regularly absenting himself or otherwise was coming on all dates except the one on which his bail bonds were cancelled.
