Petitioner-Davinder Singh @ Pantra has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.69 dated 08.05.2016, registered at Police Station Sadar, District Ludhiana, under Sections 307, 382, 452, 323, 324, 506, 427, 148, 149 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued in this case. Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of respondent-State and complainant has also appeared through his counsel. They contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

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From the record, I find that the present petitioner is named in the FIR. However, no injury has been declared dangerous to life. There are general allegations against all the accused. As argued, 14 co-accused have already been granted bail in this case and on the ground of parity also, the present petitioner is also entitled to the benefit of bail.

The petitioner has been in custody since 18.12.2016. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
