ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J. (ORAL)

The petitioners are seeking quashing of FIR No.82 dated 17.11.2010, under Sections 452, 323, 506, 427, 148, 149 of the IPC, registered at Police Station Haryana, District Hoshiarpur and all the consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise, which has been arrived at between the parties.

Learned counsel for the petitioners refers to Annexure P-2, and states that the matter has been amicably settled between the parties.

A coordinate Bench of this Court vide order dated 01.08.2017 had directed the parties to appear before the trial Court to record the statements of the parties with regard to genuineness of the compromise and send a report to this Court. The report of JMIC, Hoshiarpur dated 29.08.2017 has been received, wherein it is stated that in pursuance to the order of this Court, the statements of

the parties were recorded which indicates that the compromise is genuine, without any coercion or undue influence.

In view of the mandate of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of *Narinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another, (2014) 6 SCC 466*, no useful purpose will be served by continuing the criminal proceedings. Therefore, the petition is allowed and FIR No.83 dated 17.11.2010, under Sections 452, 323, 506, 427, 148, 149 of the IPC, registered at Police Station Haryana, District Hoshiarpur and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed qua the petitioners.
