By this petition, the petitioner seeks the concession of “interim regular bail” for a period of three months on medical grounds.

Upon notice having been issued, a reply of the Superintendent of the Women Jail, Ludhiana, has been filed, to the effect that upon general complaint of abdomen pain and heavy periods etc., the petitioner was treated in the hospital but thereafter, due to continued complaint of pain in the abdomen, she was referred to the Gynaecolgy department in the Civil Hospital on 14.09.2016, where she was advised ultrasound of the abdomen and pelvic region which was got conducted, along with tests conducted for HIV, HCV, VDRL, which were all found to be negative. (Though her haemoglobin is seem to be only 8.2 grams).

As regards the ultrasonography conducted upon her, it was

found that her uterus was normal and was not tender and that there was no

discharge or bleeding. Finally, the reply states that the petitioner was put on medical treatment by the Gynaecologist and follow up has been advised.

Hence, at least on medical grounds, she does not seem to be in any need of interim bail presently and is being given treatment for any normal issues arising.

However, it is also expected that her haemoglobin being rather low, she would be given appropriate treatment for the same.

With the aforesaid observations, the petition is found to be without merit presently and is dismissed.
