Quashing of FIR No. 218 dated 26.03.2013 under Sections 406/498-A/506 IPC, registered at Police Station Gurgaon City, District Gurgaon, is being sought on the basis of compromise deed dated 10.12.2016 (Annexure P-2)

Respondent No. 2 got married to petitioner No. 1 on 10.03.2007. Out of this wedlock, two male children were born. Due to temperamental differences, both the parties could not live together as husband and wife. The relationship between them became strained and F.I.R was registered against the petitioners on account of harassment and humiliation caused by the petitioners on the pretext of bringing less dowry by respondent No. 2.

However, the matter has now been duly compromised, on the basis of compromise deed dated 10.12.2016 (Annexure P-2).

In compliance of order dated 31.01.2017, report dated

08.03.2017 of Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Gurugram has been received in this regard. As per report, statement of the complainant and joint statement of petitioners have been recorded and they stated that the matter has been duly compromised between them. The compromise has been entered voluntarily. The complainant has no objection if the F.I.R be quashed against the petitioners. Petitioner No. 1 and Respondent No. 2 have also filed a petition for dissolution of marriage.

Consequently, in view of the status report dated 08.03.2017 and in view of the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in cases of ***Dr. Arvind Barsaul etc. versus State of Madhya Pradesh and another 2008(2) RCR (Criminal) 910***, ***Madan Mohan Abbot vs. State of Punjab 2008(2) RCR (Criminal) 429*** ***and*** the law laid down by the Full Bench of this Court in the case of ***Kulwinder Singh and Ors. vs. State of Punjab and another 2007(3) RCR (Crl.) 1052***, no useful purpose would be served in prolonging the litigation.

Accordingly, FIR No. 218 dated 26.03.2013 under Sections 406/498-A/506 IPC, registered at Police Station Gurgaon City, District Gurgaon, is quashed along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom qua petitioners.

The petition stands disposed of.
