Petitioner-Kawaljit Kaur has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.114 dated 22.05.2017, registered at Police Station Sadar Patiala, District Patiala, under Section 306 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of respondent-State and complainant has also appeared through his counsel. They contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

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From the record, I find that there are 4-5 suicide notes by the deceased. As per the prosecution version and suicide notes, the main allegations are against Davinder Kaur Anand, Jasbir Singh Anand and Mahinder Singh. Even the name of the present petitioner is not mentioned in any of the suicide notes. The whole family has been named in the suicide notes. The present petitioner, who is mother of Jasbir Singh Anand, has not taken any money as a loan from the deceased. Neither she was the tenant in the property of the deceased, nor she filed any suit against the deceased.

The petitioner has been in custody since 11.06.2017. She is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as she is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to her furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
