The instant petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking a direction for the respondents No. 2 to 6 to conduct a free, fair and impartial investigation in FIR No. 92 dated 8.5.2017 under Sections 376/34 IPC registered at Police Station, Kotwali Bathinda, Tehsil and District Bhandia.

It is contended that the son of the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the aforesaid FIR with malafide intention. It is averred in the petition that the petitioner has already made a representation (Annexure P/5) for conducting a fair investigation, but no action has been taken thereon.

Notice of motion to the official respondents.

At this stage, Mr. Abhaypal Singh Gill, Assistant Advocate General, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents-State and submits that the official respondents will look into the matter and will

decide the representation of the petitioner within a period of six weeks, on receipt of certified copy of this order.

Let three copies of the paper book be supplied to the learned counsel for the State during the course of the day. It is made clear that in case the copies of the petition are not supplied, as directed, no further action is called for.

In view of the above, I dispose of the instant petition by directing the official respondents to decide the representation (Annexure P-5) of the petitioner within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order, in accordance with law.

The petition stands disposed of in the above-said terms.
