ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J. (ORAL)

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 250 dated 27.07.2017 under Sections 389/406/506/34 IPC registered at Police Station Baldev Nagar, District Ambala.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that allegations in the FIR are that the petitioner, who is working as Sales Manager in Reliance Life Insurance Company, had obtained a loan of ₹6,70,000/- from the complainant, who is working as Branch Manager and as per the contents of FIR itself, she had returned an amount of ₹2,20,000/- to the complainant. Learned counsel further contends that in the FIR itself, the complainant has mentioned that when he threatened the petitioner, she had paid a sum of ₹2,20,000/- to him.

This Court, by the order dated 08.09.2017, had directed the petitioner to join investigation and in the event of her arrest, she was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Naresh Kumar, states that in pursuance to the order dated 08.09.2017, the petitioner has joined investigation but the mobile phone from which she has sent whatsapp messages threatening the complainant, is yet to be recovered.

In view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner and the fact that petitioner has joined the investigation and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, the order dated 08.09.2017, granting ad-interim bail to the petitioner, is hereby made absolute. However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

The petition stands disposed of accordingly.
