It is contended that Dilshad Khan aged about 25 years belonging to Muslim religion has got married with petitioner No.2 Jyoti aged about 22 years belonging to Hindu religion despite the fact that family and relatives of Jyoti were opposed to the matrimonial alliance, as such, such relatives arrayed as respondents No.4 to 6 are threatening to interfere in marital life of the petitioners, therefore, the petitioners have approached this Court for protection of their lives and liberty.

The petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to look into the representation (**Annexure P-4**) submitted by the petitioners and to provide requisite security to the petitioners, if the circumstances so require. However, this direction will not validate the marriage said to have taken place between the petitioners and will have no effect on any civil or criminal action which could be initiated in the matter in accordance with law.
