Petitioner-Angrej Singh has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.148 dated 29.07.2017, registered at Police Station Jamalpur, District Ludhiana, under Sections 379-B and 34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that complainant-Baljinder Singh has got the FIR registered by stating that Angrej Singh (present petitioner)

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snatched an amount of ₹1,500/- from his pocket, Paramjit Singh @ Lakha also snatched his mobile phone from his right pocket by giving threat to his life and thereafter, they forced him to run away.

Challan has already been presented. The petitioner has been in custody since 29.07.2017. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹40,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
