The petitioners have filed the present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. seeking quashing of FIR No.21 dated 29.03.2016 registered under Sections 342, 323, 506, 148, 149 IPC (Section 327 IPC added later on) and Sections 25/27/54/59 Arms Act at Police Station Chattiwind, District Amritsar Rural in view of compromise.

Heard learned counsel for the rival parties.

Learned counsel appearing for respondent/complainant submits that compromise has been arrived at between the parties.

This Court had made order dated 04.10.2016 asking for recording of statement in order to find out the correctness and genuineness of the compromise said to have been arrived at between the parties.

Accordingly, statements have been recorded by the trial Court and report has been received by this Court. Looking to the report it

is seen that the compromise is voluntary and genuine. I have seen the offences registered against the petitioners. Looking to the nature of the offence I think the compromise/compounding should be allowed.

In view of the above, I make the following order:

ORDER

- (i) CRL. MISC. No.M-35714 OF 2016 is allowed.
- (ii) The FIR No.21 dated 29.03.2016 registered under Sections 342, 323, 506, 148, 149 IPC (Section 327 IPC added later on) and Sections 25/27/54/59 Arms Act at Police Station Chattiwind, District Amritsar Rural, is quashed along with all consequential proceedings, qua the petitioners.
