Prayer in this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.0342 dated 08.08.2017 under Section 61 of Punjab Excise Act, 1914 and Sections 420/465/468 IPC, registered at Police Station Sadar Ballabgarh, District Faridabad.

As per FIR on 08.08.2017 when the police party headed by ASI Devender Kumar was on patrolling duty at Sector 3, Tigaon road, a secret information was received that one Tilak Raj and Gian Singh are indulged in preparing and selling illicit liquor in their house in Village Mujeri. On the basis of said information, it was found that Tilak Raj and Gian Singh were preparing illicit liquor and filling the same in the nips. Tilak Raj was arrested on 08.08.2017. He made a

disclosure statement that he used to purchase spirit and other articles for preparing illicit liquor from the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has argued that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in the case whereas the other two accused were apprehended at the spot and no recovery was effected from the petitioner and the involvement of the petitioner is based on political consideration. The petitioner has no nexus either directly or indirectly with the co-accused, namely, Tilak Raj and Gian Singh.

Short reply by way of affidavit of Balbir Singh, HPS, Assistant Commissioner of Police, Tigaon, Faridabad, filed in Court today on behalf of respondent-State of Haryana, is taken on record. In para No.4 of the reply, a list of cases registered against the petitioner has been furnished.

In view of the fact that there are other cases against the petitioner which includes the cases under the Excise Act also, no case for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner is made out.

Accordingly, present petition is dismissed.
