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**ANUPINDER SINGH GREWAL, J. (ORAL)**

The petitioner is seeking quashing of FIR No.59 dated 04.04.2015, under Sections 452, 506, 427, 34 IPC, registered at Police Station P.A.U., District Ludhiana, on the basis of compromise dated 07.09.2017 (Annexure P-3) arrived at between the parties.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the FIR is an outcome of a matrimonial dispute between the sister of the petitioner and brother of respondent No.2, which has now been resolved and the matter has been compromised. He further contends that it is a case of no injury and only windshield of the Car of the complainant was stated to have been broken.

This Court by the order dated 18.09.2017 had directed the parties to appear before the trial Court to record the statements of the parties with regard to genuineness of the compromise and send a report to this Court. The report of JMIC,

Ludhiana, dated 04.10.2017 has been received, wherein it is stated that in pursuance to the order of this Court, the statements of the parties were recorded which indicates that the compromise is genuine, without any coercion or undue influence.

The FIR is an outcome of a matrimonial dispute between the sister of the petitioner and brother of respondent No.2, which has now been resolved and the matter has been compromised. It is a case of no injury and only windshield of the Car of the complainant was stated to have been broken.

In view of the mandate of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of ***Narinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another, (2014) 6 SCC 466***, no useful purpose will be served by continuing the criminal proceedings. Therefore, the petition is allowed and FIR No.59 dated 04.04.2015, under Sections 452, 506, 427, 34 IPC, registered at Police Station P.A.U., District Ludhiana (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed qua the petitioner(s).
