Vakalatnama filed on behalf of respondents No.2 to 4 is taken on record.

Through this petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, prayer has been made for quashing F.I.R. No.81 dated 04.06.2016 registered under Sections 406, 420, 120-B of the Indian Penal Code (Section 419 IPC added later on), at Police Station SBS Nagar, on the basis of compromise dated 23.08.2017 (Annexure-P2).

On presentation of the petition, vide order dated 21.09.2017 passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court, the parties were directed to appear before the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate on 12.10.2017 for recording their statements qua compromise with a direction to the trial Court/ Illaq Magistrate, to furnish a report qua veracity thereof, if any, between the

parties.

Consequently, the parties had appeared before the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Shaheed Bhagat Singh Nagar and got recorded their statements. Report from the concerned Magistrate has been received vide letter bearing No.202 dated 24.10.2017 duly forwarded by learned District and Sessions Judge, Shaheed Bhagat Singh Nagar vide Endst. No.733/DSJ-19A dated 24.10.2017.

According to the report of Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Shaheed Bhagat Singh Nagar, the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine, voluntary, without any coercion and without any undue influence.

In view of the totality of the facts and circumstances and considering the fact that the compromise will bring harmony in relations between the parties, the present petition is accepted and the aforesaid F.I.R. No.81, is quashed qua the petitioners.
