INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioner-Ramesh Kumar has filed this petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.78 dated 17.08.2017, registered at Police Station Ghanour, District Patiala, under Sections 307, 34 and 120-B of IPC and Section 302 of IPC, added later on.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and have gone through the record.

From the record, I find that FIR, in the present case, was got registered by deceased himself and the said statement will now be treated as dying declaration. As per the FIR, when deceased-Ujjagar Singh reached to the house of his brother-Ramesh Kumar for deliberations qua the disputed land, then Ramesh Kumar and his elder son poured petrol upon him and set him ablaze.

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Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case and in view of nature and gravity of the offence and in view of the facts that the petitioner is named in the FIR; that he is stated to be one of the main case and that the petitioner is required for custodial interrogation, I do not find it a fit case where the petitioner is entitled to the benefit of anticipatory bail.

Therefore, finding no merit in the present petition, the same is dismissed.
