The present petition has been filed under Section 438
Cr.P.C seeking anticipatory bail in case FIR No. 20 dated 11.08.2017
registered under Sections 406 and 498-A IPC at Police Station Dhar
Kalan, District Pathankot.

On 15.11.2017 this Court had passed the following
order:-

“A draft of Rs.25,000/- in favour of the complainant is handed over
to the I.O for onwards delivery to the complainant/respondent No.2.
Fresh notice to respondent No.2 be issued for the next date of
hearing.

The petitioner is allowed to join the investigation.

Post again on 19.12.2017.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest of the petitioner by the Arresting Officer, he shall be released on interim bail subject to the following conditions:-

1. That he shall make himself available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required;
2. That he shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer and;
3. That he shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court.”

It is contended that in pursuance of the order dated 15.11.2017, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions, states that the petitioner has joined the investigation and he is not required for custodial interrogation.

Learned counsel for respondent No.2/complainant states that the petitioner made concealment with regard to divorce petition filed by him.

In view of above, the order dated 15.11.2017 passed by this Court is made absolute, subject to furnishing of bail-bonds/surety bonds by the petitioner to the satisfaction of the CJM/Duty Magistrate concerned. However, the petitioner shall not leave the country without written permission of this Court. In case the petitioner holds any passport, he shall surrender the same before the trial Court.

A draft of Rs.25,000/- in favour of the complainant
has been handed over to respondent No.2/complainant.

The petition stands allowed.
