Through these two petitions under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, prayer has been made for quashing F.I.R. No.154 dated 01.12.2016 under Sections 323, 326, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code (for short, 'IPC') and Cross Case Rapat No.22 dated 02.12.2016 registered under Sections 323, 326, 148 and 149 IPC arising out of aforementioned F.I.R., at Police Station Bhikhiwind, District Tarn Taran, on the basis of compromise dated 28.08.2017 (Annexure-P3).

Vide order dated 28.09.2017 passed by this Court in CRM-M-36538-2017 and order dated 03.10.2017 passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CRM-M-36670-2017, parties were directed to appear before the trial Court/ Illaqa Magistrate to get their statements recorded qua compromise with a direction to the trial Court to furnish a report alongwith the recorded statements qua veracity thereof, if any, between the parties.

Consequently, the parties had appeared before the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Patti on 13.10.2017 and got recorded their statements qua compromise. Report from the concerned Magistrate has been received vide letter No.364 dated 27.10.2017 duly forwarded by learned District and Sessions Judge, Tarn Taran vide Endst. No.6106-R dated 27.10.2017.

According to the report of Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Patti, the compromise between the parties is genuine, voluntarily, without any coercion or undue influence with their free will.

In view of the totality of the facts and circumstances and considering the fact that the compromise will bring harmony in relations between the parties, the aforesaid F.I.R. No.154 and Cross Case registered vide Rapat No.22, are hereby quashed.

Petitions are disposed of accordingly.
