Respondent-Gurdev Singh filed a petition for divorce before the trial Court invoking the provisions under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act. A decree of divorce was granted by the trial Court. Appellant-Bhupinder Kaur @ Gurpreet Kaur has preferred the present appeal challenging the decree of divorce granted by the trial Court in favour of the respondent-husband.

The appellant has placed on record a compromise deed dated 28.07.2016 (Annexure A-1). Both the parties have subscribed their signatures to the said compromise deed in the presence of the witnesses. Both the parties alongwith their respective counsel were present in Court. We interacted with them. They submitted that the compromise deed was

entered into with their full knowledge. They also agreed that they shall abide by the terms and conditions of the compromise deed in which one of the terms is that the decree of divorce granted by the trial Court in favour of the respondent-husband may be set aside and the appellant and the respondent shall live happily together as husband and wife.

In view of the settlement arrived at between the parties in terms of compromise deed (Annexure A-1), it is submitted by the counsel appearing for either side that the decree of divorce granted in favour of the respondent by the trial Court may be set aside and the appeal may be allowed.

In view of the above facts and circumstances, the decree of divorce granted by the trial Court in favour of the respondent stands set aside and the appeal is allowed.
