By filing the present petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, the petitioner has sought regular bail in case FIR No.403 dated 13.05.2016, registered under Sections 399 and 402 of the Indian Penal Code (for short 'the IPC') and Section 25 of the Arms Act, at Police Station Sadar, Hisar.

Contents that the petitioner was allegedly arrested on the secret information. He has been shown to be in possession of chinese torch. The petitioner is in custody since 13.05.2016. Co-accused, Vishal and Navraj, have been admitted to bail by the trial Court and by this Court, respectively.

On the other hand, the learned State counsel, on instructions, states that out of 17 prosecution witnesses, none has been examined so far.

The challan has been presented.

Heard.

Considering the facts that co-accused, Vishal and Navraj, have been admitted to bail by the trial Court and by this Court, respectively; the petitioner is in custody since 13.05.2016; challan has been presented; and out of 17 prosecution witnesses, none has been examined so far, trial is likely to take a long time, therefore, no purpose would be served in keeping the petitioner behind the bars. Without adverting to the merits of the instant case, this petition is allowed. The petitioner be admitted to bail during the pendency of the trial, on his furnishing bail bonds and surety bonds, to the satisfaction of the trial Court, concerned.
