Through this petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, prayer has been made for quashing F.I.R. No.66 dated 23.10.2014 registered under Sections 307, 506, 380, 411 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25/27 of the Arms Act, at Police Station 'D' Division, Amrtisar City, District Amritsar, on the basis of compromise dated 30.09.2016 (Annexure-P2).

Vide order dated 18.01.2017 passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court, the petitioner as also respondent No.2 were directed to appear before the trial Court on 25.01.2017, i.e. the date already fixed before that Court, to get their statements recorded for compromise with a direction to the trial Court to furnish a report alongwith the recorded statements qua veracity of the compromise, if any, between the parties.

Consequently, the parties had appeared before the Additional Sessions Judge, Amritsar, on 25.01.2017 and got recorded their statements for compromise and report from the concerned Judge has also been received vide letter bearing No.22 dated 31.01.2017 duly forwarded by learned District and Sessions Judge, Amritsar vide Endst. No.996R dated 02.02.2017.

According to the report of Additional Sessions Judge, Amritsar, the compromise between the parties is genuine and without any pressure or undue influence.

Learned counsel for the respondent-State has fairly conceded that the provisions of Section 307 IPC are not attracted in the case as there is no injury on the person of the complainant or anyone else.

In view of the totality of the facts and circumstances and considering the fact that the compromise will bring harmony in relations between the parties, the present petition is accepted and the aforesaid F.I.R. No.66, is hereby quashed qua the petitioner only.
