Prayer in this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR no.92 dated 13.09.2017 under Section 21 NDPS Act, P.S. Chamkaur Sahib, District Rupnagar.

As per the FIR, the allegation against the petitioner is that the petitioner after handing over the bag containing 15 grams of intoxicant powder to co-accused Ramanpreet Singh, ran away from the spot. It is by the co-accused Ramanpreet Singh who was caught by the police at the spot, the name of the petitioner was disclosed.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Dharampal, submits that in fact, it is the petitioner who was in possession of the bag containing 15 grams of intoxicant powder, but he handed over the said bag to co-accused Ramanpreet Singh and ran away. When Ramanpreet was caught by the police, he disclosed that the said bag containing 15 grams of intoxicant powder was handed over to him by the petitioner.

Keeping in view the fact that there is specific allegation against the petitioner that he has handed over a bag containing 15 grams of intoxicant powder to co-accused Ramanpreet Singh, no ground for anticipatory bail is made out.

The petition is dismissed.
