Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for issuance of directions to respondents No.1 to 4 to take appropriate legal action against respondent No.5 who is trying to forcibly take away the vehicle of the petitioner i.e. Truck bearing registration No.PB06-M-9713.

Learned counsel for respondent No.5 states that the respondents are not taking forcible possession but since the petitioner has not paid the outstanding amount i.e. about ₹7 lakhs as on date, they are proceeding against him in accordance with law. He further states that the petitioner was required to clear the outstanding dues by the month of April, 2016.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

Since the petitioner himself is defaulter and is not making the payment as per schedule agreed between the parties, present petition deserves to be dismissed. While making recovery of the loan amount, it is expected that respondents shall act in accordance with law.

With the aforesaid observations, present petition stands dismissed.
